When using our website, we will ask if you consent to our use of cookies as described in this Cookie Policy.

Please note - within our website, we link to other websites. These sites operate under their own cookie policies, which you can see on each specific site.

Understanding Cookies

A “cookie” is a small text file that’s stored on your computer, smartphone, tablet, or other device if you agree when you visit a website or use an app.

Cookies contain information that is transferred to your device and some cookies may collect personal data about you. Cookies are very useful for websites and do lots of different jobs which help to make your experience on our site as smooth as possible. For example, they let you move between web pages efficiently, remembering your preferences, and generally improving your experience.

Managing cookies through this website

Our website uses different types of cookies and uses a system called **Cookiebot** to help you view and manage your cookie preferences.

We use **Necessary cookies** to help ensure our website works correctly. These cookies are essential for the operation of our website and will remain active for the duration of your visit unless you choose to specifically disable them by changing your browser settings. If you do disable these cookies, please be aware that some parts of our website may not function correctly.

We also use various **Optional cookies** for insight purposes to collect information about how you use our website which can help us improve your experience. These optional cookies collect information in an anonymous way and you cannot be identified as an individual through the data we collect. Some **optional cookies** are placed by third party services that appear on our pages.

All optional cookies are inactive for the duration of your visit unless you specifically consent to enable them. You can view details of the various optional cookies we use and choose to enable or disable them by clicking the **Details** tab within the Cookiebot tool that will display when you first visit our site.

You can also view details of the various optional cookies we use at any time by clicking on the **Cookies** link located in the menu bar in the footer section of our site. Each optional cookie is displayed in a table on this page, alongside a category and a description. At the bottom of this page, you can re-open the Cookiebot tool which will allow you to manage your cookie preferences by enabling or disabling the specific optional cookies shown in the Details tab.

If you change any settings, you may need to refresh the page for your changes to take effect. If you do disable any optional cookies, you may find that certain parts of our website do not work correctly or do not work at all.

Managing cookies through browser settings

Most browsers allow you to disable cookies if you would like them to. Each browser is configured differently. To disable cookies via your browser settings, you should follow the instructions given by the publisher of your browser. Please remember that any settings you change will not just affect cookies used on our website. These changes will apply to all websites that you visit (unless you choose to block cookies from particular sites).

Most browsers will allow you to:

- See what cookies you've got and delete them on an individual basis.
- Block third party cookies.
- Block cookies from particular sites.
- Block all cookies from being set.
- Delete all cookies when you close your browser.
